I want to thank my son Sayer who began traveling with me at the age of 3 years (and decades since) for his companionship, good advice and willingness to drive into war zones in Chiapas, swat mosquitos in the Amazon and enter Bogota at midnight during the chaos that took place there.

Likewise, my wife Mary Rosenberg has shown equal courage and foolhardiness, walking with me through Somalia, feeding wild hyenas in the dark, hanging out with homeless poets in Georgetown Guyana, often sleeping in rental cars to be able to study dozens of countries on our teachers' salaries. She and Sayer both contributed great photos to this work. The planet and its people are amazing. I just hope we can learn some lessons from our fellow Earthlings.
